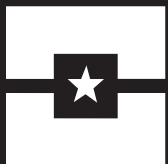

Number One— College is fun.

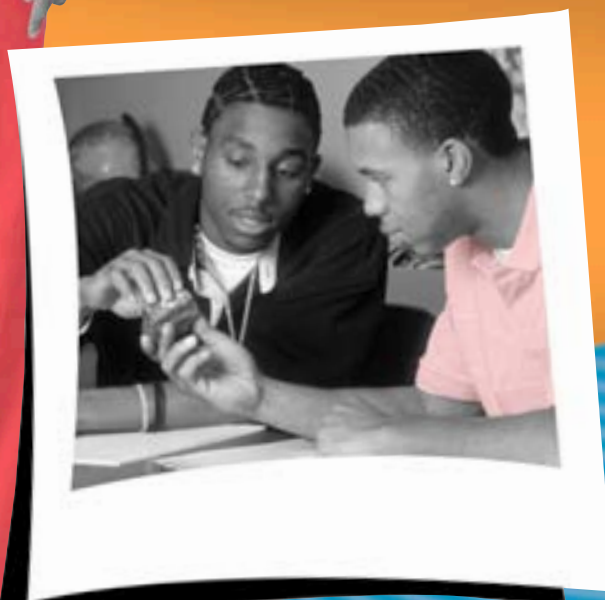
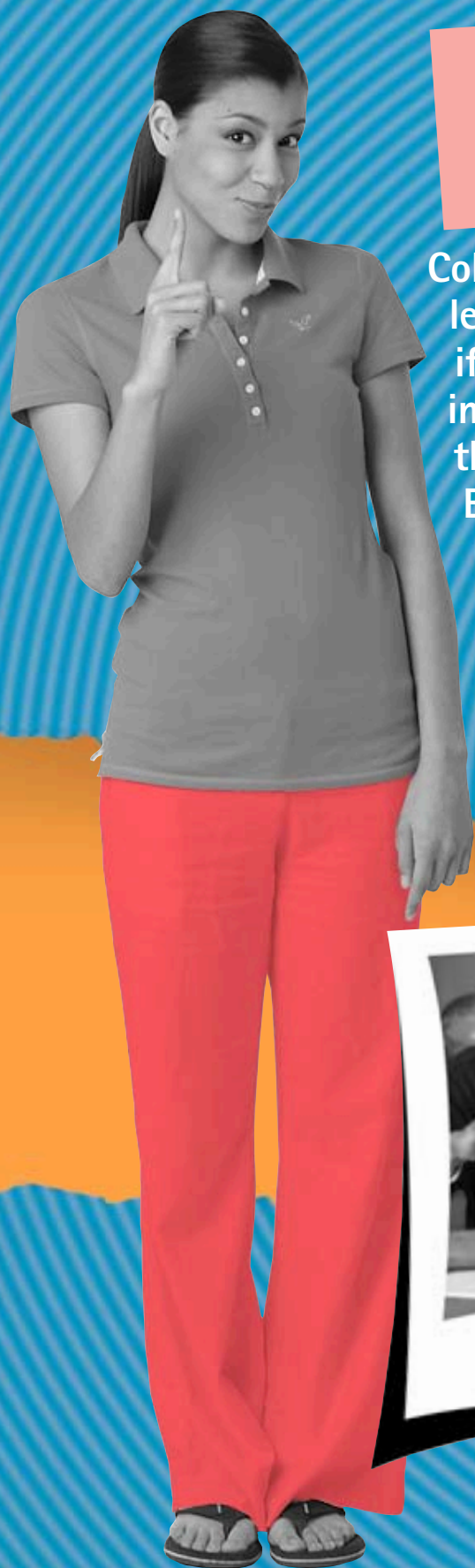

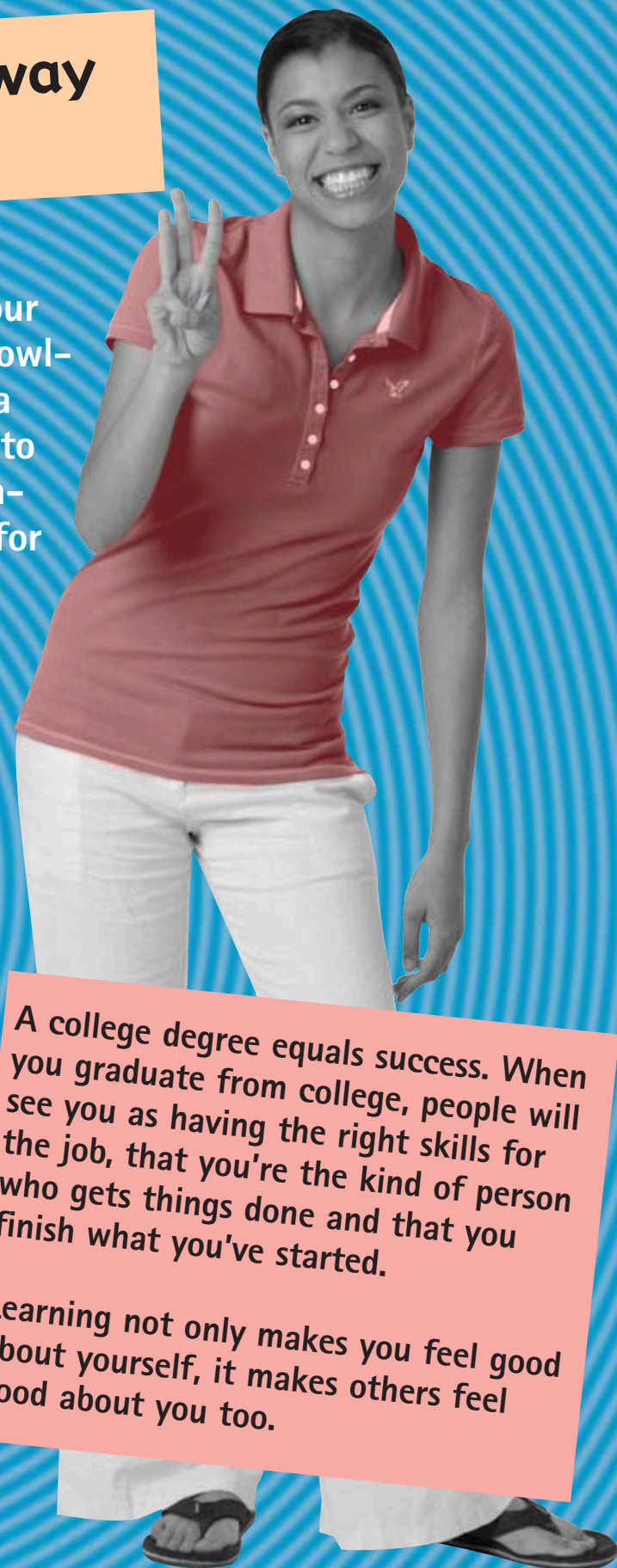
In fact, Occupational Outlook Quarterly says, if you're a college graduate, you will earn about \$1 million more throughout your life than someone with just a high school degree.

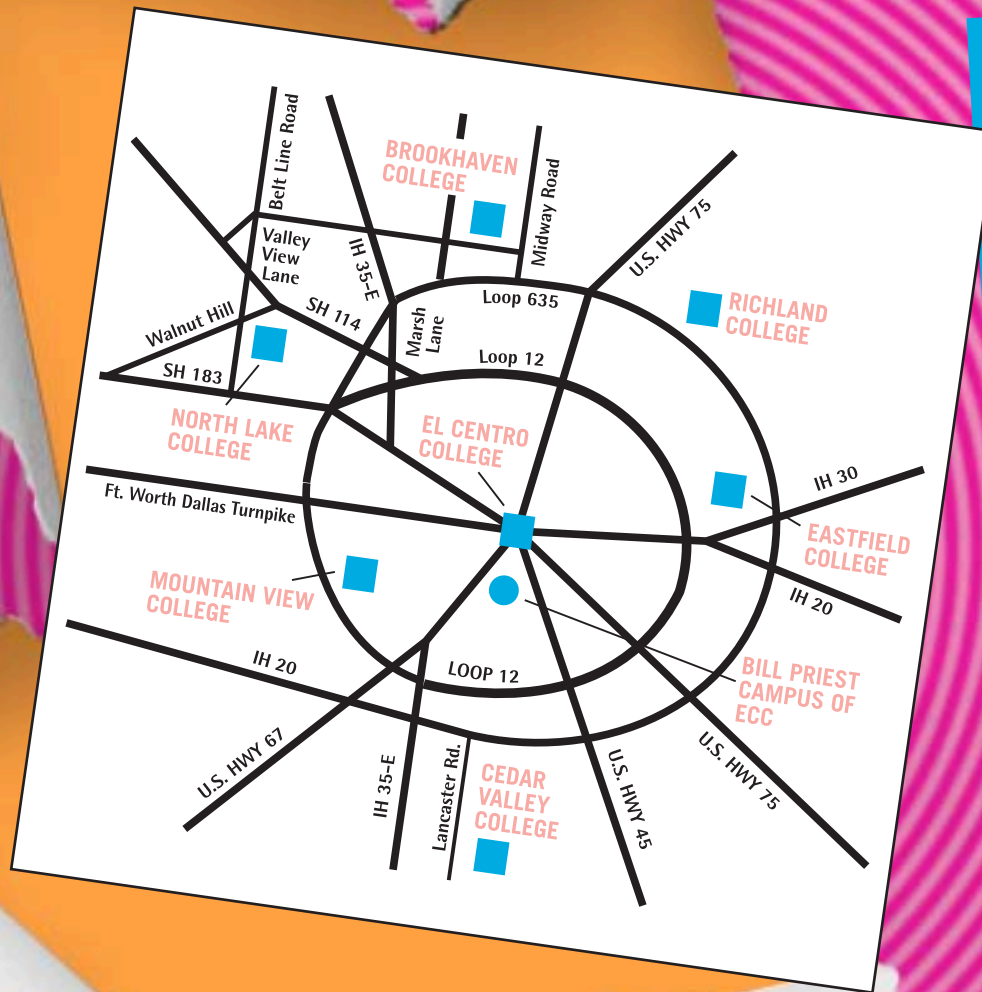
